

CAF 2022 Scholarships

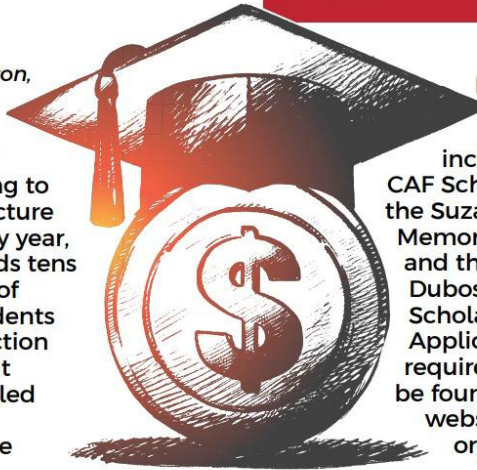

Are you, or someone you know, planning to study Architecture this fall? Every year, the CAF awards tens of thousands of dollars to students with a connection to Connecticut who are enrolled in accredited undergraduate or graduate architecture degree programs. This year students enrolled in architectural programs at Connecticut Community Colleges are eligible to apply.

The Allan Dehar Memorial Scholarship Fund was founded by family, friends, and colleagues to encourage students in a variety of educational pathways. In its inaugural year, the Fund will focus on students from the Connecticut Vocational/Technical School system and accredited architectural programs at the Connecticut Community Colleges to encourage and support students from all walks of life. Allan himself attended trade school and night school prior to working in the offices of Eero Saarinen and Minoru Yamasaki. He eventually found his own firm in New Haven and was honored as a Fellow of the AIA.

For students who have completed two years in an accredited undergraduate architectural program, or have been accepted into an accredited graduate



program, there are a variety of scholarships including the CAF Scholarships, the Suzanne Sheng Memorial Scholarship, and the Charles Dubose Memorial Scholarship. Applications and requirements can be found on the CAF website, <https://cafct.org/scholarships/>

Students at Cornell

University should note that the Suzanne Sheng Memorial Scholarship gives preference to Cornell students. In 1997, the Sheng family established a memorial scholarship fund in memory of Suzanne Sheng who was a Connecticut architect working with James Lawler, FAIA at the time of her death.

The Charles DuBose Scholarship Fund was established in 1986 by DuBose Associates of Hartford, with gifts from his widow, Ruth DuBose. This scholarship gives preference to students at the University of Pennsylvania, Georgia Institute of Technology, and the Fontainebleau summer program.

In 2023, the Jane and Kevin Roche Scholarship Fund will award its first scholarships. On April 28th, 2022, the CAF will host a celebration and lecture at Yale in honor of the Roche family's significant gift to create this new fund. Tickets are available on the CAF website.
