2022 Highlights

It was a remarkable year during which we managed not one, but two fundraising events! In April, CAF celebrated the inception of the Jane & Kevin Roche Scholarship Fund with a program at the Yale School of Architecture honoring the work of Kevin Roche. The celebration, which included a cocktail reception following the program, was attended by Jane and Kevin Roche's children, who's generous bequeathment made the Scholarship possible.

In October, CAF held a reception and dinner at Hotel Marcel, a wondrous Becker + Becker transformation of the iconic Armstrong Rubber Company Building (aka the Pirelli Building) in New Haven by Marcel Breuer. The program centered around the work of Docomomo US, a non-profit organization dedicated to the conservation of modern architecture. Founder of Docomomo US, Theo Prudon, FAIA, was engaged by Mike Crosbie in a discussion on the topic of modern architecture. Dr. Prudon was the recipient of the Connecticut Architecture Foundation Distinguished Leadership Award.

Scholarships Awarded

The mission of the Connecticut Architecture Foundation has not changed. CAF continues to encourage public understanding and community involvement in the creation and protection of architecture and the built environment. The major ways CAF makes a difference is through the giving of scholarships and grants.

Nine scholarships totaling forty-one thousand dollars were awarded in 2022, including the inaugural Allen Dehar Memorial Scholarship. Architecture students attending Yale University, Pratt Institute, Cornell University, the University of Oregon, the University of Hartford, and Norwalk Community College received scholarships. CAF also continues to support three scholarships at the University of Hartford: the Master of Architecture Scholarship, the David N. LaBau Endowed Architecture Scholarship, and the Frederick J. Mahaffey Memorial Endowed Architecture Scholarship. Over the last forty years the Foundation has awarded more than \$650,000 in scholarships.

- To AIA Connecticut for Black Spectacles, architecture course tutorials and Architectural Registration Exam preparation materials.
- To the Architectural Workshops Summer Camp, a six-week architecture, design, and engineering camp for K-8 students in Stamford.
